Why did the school choose LiteracyPlanet?

The school believes that providing students with a stimulating learning environment encourages independence and responsibility for their own personal learning, and helps to prepare them for a future beyond school.

Teachers place an emphasis on the core subjects of Literacy and Numeracy, and teaching students 21st century skills of thinking critically, applying knowledge to new situations, analysing information, comprehending new ideas, communicating,

collaborating, solving problems, and making decisions. They aim to provide students with experiences that are relevant, connected beyond the classroom, and based within appropriate contexts for learning in the information age.

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LiteracyPlanet is especially useful for engaging students who find aspects of literacy challenging.


"It gets them working on skills without them even realising they are participating in an area of learning that they are struggling with," adds Ms Matthews.
