
How digital resources are used to improve literacy outcomes.

More than 500 students in Years 1 to 6 are now benefitting from access to LiteracyPlanet on a regular basis. It is an excellent resource for guided reading, comprehension, grammar and spelling. The programme's clear instruction style and abundant examples are ideal for these students to practise literacy concepts and view their performance through useful assessment tools and an engaging leaderboard.
